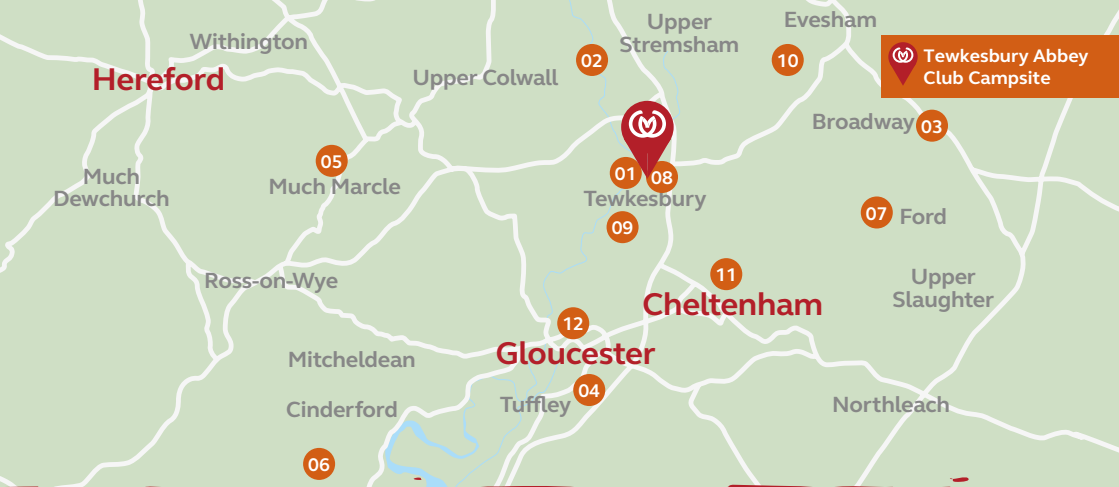

1 Tewkesbury Abbey

A tour of Tewkesbury Abbey is beautiful – a must for lovers of fine architecture and history.

2 Severn Leisure Cruises – Tewkesbury River Trips

The 12-seater Tewkesbury boats offer a ferry service from Tewkesbury, to Twyning via Croft Farm and 35 minute trips around the historic town of Tewkesbury.

3 Broadway Tower

Experience great English heritage in an inspiring location with unrivalled views.

4 The Skiing & Snowboarding Centre

This is a dry ski slope where you can learn to ski, try out some tubing or snowboard without the need for real snow.

5 Westons Cider Mill

Take a Cider Mill Tour and discover the true craft of cider-making!

6 Go Ape – Mallards Pike, Coleford

A tree-top assault course experience including two to three hours on zip wires, Tarzan swings and rope ladders. The minimum age is 10 years old, and under 15s need to be accompanied by an adult.

7 The Big Shoot – Cheltenham

Enjoy the hilariously fun and competitive thrills of clay pigeon shooting.

8 The Battle Trail

Trace the steps of 15th-century soldiers as you follow a waymarked route through the significant areas from the Battle of Tewkesbury.

9 The Severn Ham

A gorgeous, scenic walk which takes in some of the lovely nature along the River Ham.

Cycle

10 National Cycle Network

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is Route 45, Gloucester to Worcester. You can follow the route through Tewkesbury on to Bushley Green, then circle back to our site along the River Severn (roughly 10 miles).

Cyclists seeking adventure will enjoy the challenging rides up Bredon Hill, Cleeve Hill and the Malvern Hills.

11 Cheltenham

The cultural centre of the Cotswolds, this beautiful and stylish city is renowned for its great shopping, cafés, theatre and festivals.

12 Gloucester

Boasting over 2,000 years of history, this phenomenal city has roots which stretch back to the Roman times, and is well known as the 'Cathedral City of the Cotswolds'.

Visitor's top tips

I The nearby Bell Pub (dog-friendly) served great food, was very friendly and great value.

We loved the riverside walk between the Mill Avon and Severn Way towards Deerhurst – it's incredibly scenic.

The ferry trip to the Fleet Inn at Twynning is very pleasant.

Ride the Gloucestershire steam train into Cheltenham.

Try the Cafe Chocolat, it's dog-friendly and has a delightful atmosphere.

Take a history trail tour around the charming Tewkesbury.

We simply loved wandering around the town, visiting the lovely shops, cafés, pubs and museums.

There are many National Trust properties in the area, including Croome Court and Chedworth Roman Villa.

The Mezbaan Indian Restaurant on Church St is excellent and only a 5-minute walk from the site.

The English Heritage Witley Court and Gardens is well-worth a visit.
