

- 1 Gulliver's Kingdom**
A family theme park with rides and attractions.
- 2 Crich Tramway Village**
Travel on vintage trams, explore the exhibitions and enjoy the woodland walk sculpture trail.
- 3 Denby Visitor Centre**
Denby factory shop, pottery tours and free cookery demonstrations.
- 4 Heage Windmill**
Built in 1797 and the only working six-sailed stone tower windmill in England.

There are miles of scenic cycle paths on the doorstep, together with 2 bike-hire centres. The area is quite hilly so some local routes may be difficult.



A small but vibrant market town which is renowned as the world's first cotton mill town. From rich heritage and fascinating history to a modern town centre and lots of independent shops, there is something for everyone to enjoy.

Home to a traditional indoor Market Hall, historic properties and a stunning park.



Visitor's top tips

Cromford Mills

Get down to the Fisherman's Rest for a warm welcome, serving excellent food - it's also dog-friendly.

Don't miss Bakewell market on Mondays, make sure you go early as it gets busy. Belper also has a farmers market every other Saturday.

The local canals are great for a gentler walk with great tea shops along the way.

If you're visiting in July then Belper has an excellent food festival which is worth checking out.

The King Street Fish Bar and George's Chip Shop in Belper both serve excellent fish & chips!

The Crich Tramway Village is such a lovely day out, and it's dog-friendly.

Belper is very close to site and has lots of great pubs, shops and eateries - we particularly enjoyed the little vegan cafe thats hidden in the antique shop.

We visited several Heritage Railways during our visit, including the Peak Rail, Ecclesbourne Valley Railway and the Butterfly Midland.

The Cromford Mills is a wonderful day out for the family.
