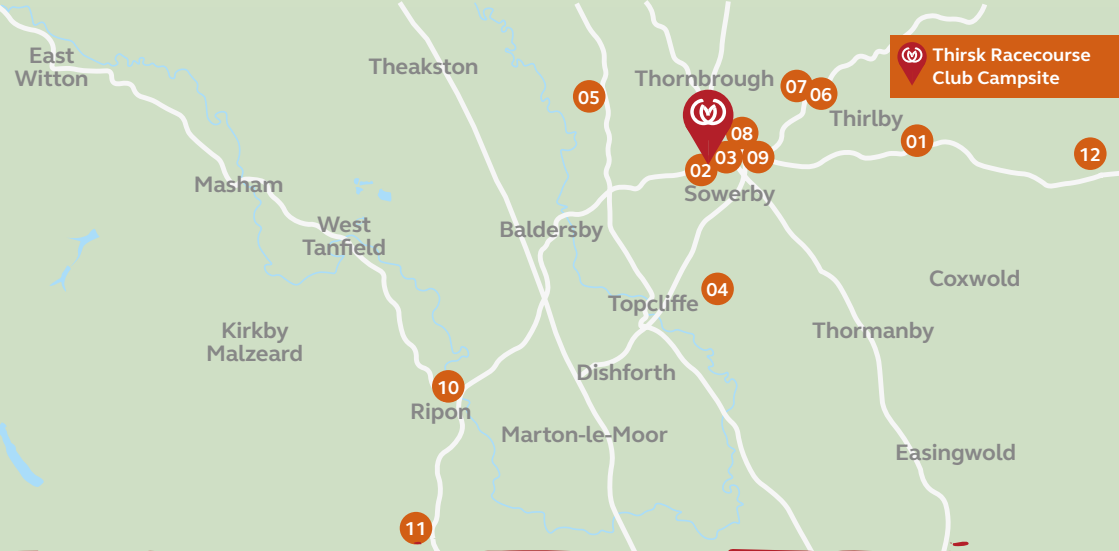

1 Castle Howard

One of Britain's finest historic houses with rolling parklands and awe-inspiring architecture.

2 Thirsk Museum

Experience the history of Thirsk in the house where Thomas Lord was born in 1755. Explore rooms full of fascinating exhibits featuring local life and industry.

3 Newby Hall

Visitor's top tips

II The Town Museum (free entry) and the World of James Herriot Museum in Thirsk are both interesting visits.

Visit the National Park Visitor Centre and admire the views at Sutton Bank, stated as the finest view in England by James Herriot.

Lovely park and riverside walk for those with dogs, and most of the local pubs were dog friendly.

Visit Ripon for a lovely day out, the Cathedral is lovely and the market is very good.

Thirsk Market is held on Mondays and Saturdays in the main square.

The White Horse Cafe fish & chip shop in Thirsk Market Square serves absolutely wonderful food.

The National Trust's Fountains Abbey and Nunnington Hall are great visits, as is the English Heritage Rievaulx Abbey.

Thirsk is home to lots of lovely pubs, shops and eateries – Bliss Cafe is dog-friendly and The Golden Fleece has a dog-friendly area too.

The train to York is great value, and is ideal for a day out in the city.

If you're willing to travel out a little further, Robin Hood's Bay is absolutely stunning, around an hour away. **II**
