The Transporter Bridge is the only working one of its kind in UK and one of only eight in the world. It's well worth a visit.

Bus stop approx 20 minute's walk, the number 30 bus goes to Newport and Cardiff. Please note that the correct fare is required and English bus passes are not valid.


There is a Park & Ride to Cardiff, follow signs from Junction 29 of M4.

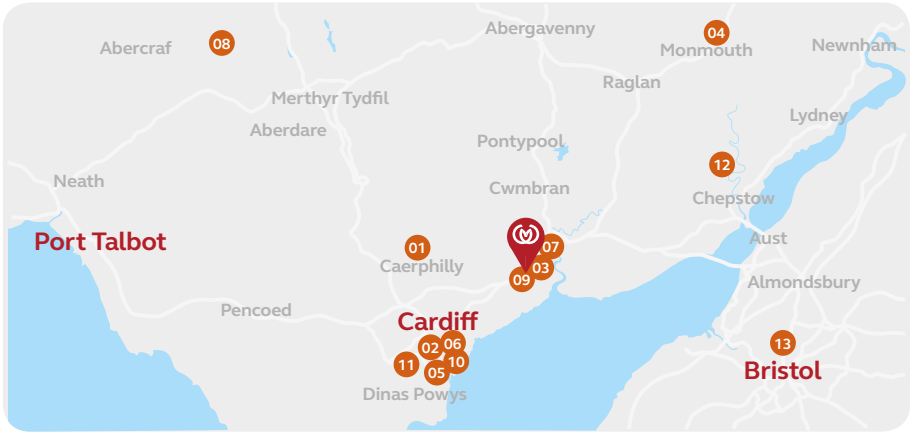
