
12 Stratford-upon-Avon

Enjoy canal and river walks along the Saltisford Arm of the Grand Union Canal.

The circular route of the racecourse on the common land is an easy walk (1.25-1.5miles) or try the walk to Hatton Locks (3.8miles).

Warwick is a lovely old town with lots of places to sit have a coffee and watch the world go by. If you want to walk into the historic town, the map provided in the information room is very useful.


We use the Four Penny Pub very close to site for a lovely atmosphere and excellent meals.

There is a bus service 5 minutes walk away, which goes to Stratford-on-Avon, Leamington Spa and Coventry.

There is an Esso, 0.4 miles from site and a BP garage 4.4 miles away.

Nearest cashpoint

There is a cashpoint at Sainsburys approximately half a mile away.
