Visitor's top tips

There's excellent dog walking along the river, as well as access to the city centre within a 10 minute walk.

Visit at Christmas, York is magical.

Great for cycling and walking either into town or along the river, past the racecourse and into the countryside. There's a fantastic bike ride to Narburn Marina and a good to walk around the city walls.

There are lots of dog friendly pubs in the city centre.

A York visitors pass is excellent value and gets you in to lots of the sites.

The local high street (Bishopthorpe Rd) out of the rear gate has an array of great little shops and the cake from the deli is lush!
