
REFRESHMENTS/FACILITIES

DIRECTIONS

- 1 Leave the Site and turn right on to the main Hopcott Road, then after half a mile, turn right on to Church Street opposite Alcombe Village Hall.
- 2 Go straight over on to Combeland Road by the Britannia Inn and follow signs for Dunster. Keep going straight until you reach the castle entrance.
- 3 Turn left at the castle entrance on to Church Street (A396), which turns into High Street, then down Dunster Steep.
- 4 Turn left on to the cycle lane by T- junction traffic lights. Take the subway under the A39 and continue on the cycle lane towards Minehead.
- 5 At the 'Welcome to Minehead' roundabout, cross Seaward Way and continue on the cycle lane towards the seafront.
- 6 Turn left on to Warren Road and continue along the Esplanade and Quay Street along the seafront.
- 7 At the roundabout at the end of Quay Street, turn round and head back up the road, then turn right on to Blenheim Road.
- 8 At the end of Blenheim Road, turn right on to The Parade and head straight on to Park Street.
- 9 Follow the road round to the right and heading uphill, go straight on to The Parks.
- 10 At the top of the hill, turn left on to Periton Road at T-junction. Keep heading downhill along this road and you will see Minehead Club Site on your right.
