## Get to know your site

This is a tranquil, open site in the midst of the Broads, equidistant from the villages of Horning and Ludham, in England's newest National Park with its special landscape.

The Norfolk Broads combine over 200 miles of waterways with windmills, market towns and lovely river settings in between. Wroxham (4 miles) and Hoveton form the boating centre and the attractive villages of

Potter Heigham and Horning are both nearby.

The river is only 200 yards from the site and boats and cycles can be hired. Wroxham Barns house 14 working craftsmen alongside a Junior Farm, children's playground and summer funfair.

A visit to Norwich is a must with its daily market, interesting Castle and fine Norman Cathedral.

# General site information

## Reception Services

### Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board at Reception.

### Site shop

Open at the same times as Reception. The shop sells toilet chemicals, gas and TV cables.

### Information Room

Open at all times. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

### Mobile telephones

Some mobile phones do not work in the area.

## Pitches

### Pitch care

Please lift awning ground sheets daily.

### Motorhomes

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motorhome sign on display.

### Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, it is normally not a problem unless the site is fully booked. Please see notice at Reception.

### Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

### TV reception

Television reception is good with a booster system. The best frequencies for TV reception are: BBC1 - 62; BBC2 - 55; ITV - 59; Channel 4 - 65; The EHU bollards have a TV socket.

### Electric Hook-up

The costs of electricity are included in your pitch fee, but please help us minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. Also any saving could help to reduce pitch fees or help towards investments in new sites or redevelopments.

## Site Facilities

Please see the Site map for locations of amenity blocks.

### Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning at the times shown on the block door. There is a baby and toddler bathroom for children under 4 years old. Please ask at Reception for the key. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times. The disabled toilet and shower facilities are located next to the main block.

### Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are: Washing machine £3.00, Tumble drier 70p/cycle. Washing sinks are also available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

### Play areas

There is a playground with play equipment. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times.

## Safety on Site

### Fire point

(to activate alarm/warning)  
Located at all service points.  
Assembly point is opposite Reception.

### Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. There is a dog walk on site and dogs can also be walked off-site by the river, 200 yards away.

### Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception.

## Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.



## Close by

### Supermarkets

There is a mini-market in Bridge Stores nearby and Throwers in Ludham village 2 miles away with a good delicatessen. The closest supermarket is Roys in Wroxham, about 5 1/2 miles from the site. There are Tesco stores 7 and 10 miles away.

### Cinema

In Norwich, about 10 miles from the site.

### Swimming pool

In Horning, about 2 miles from the site.

### Tourist Information Centre

In Wroxham.

### Public Transport

There is a bus service from outside the site, that goes to Norwich. There is a park & ride into Norwich at Sprowston, 10 miles from the site on the A1151.

### Places of Worship

There is a C of E Church in Ludham and a Catholic Church in Hoveton.
