Activities

Cycling

Cycling is suggested along the river bank to Selby (15 miles).

The nearest National Cycle Network route to this site is Manchester to Beverley (Pennine Cycle Way), Route 66, OS ref SE605508.

This is a very popular site, level and on the banks of the Ouse, within easy walking distance of the beautiful and historic city of York and a good base to explore Yorkshire.

York is a feast – there's so much to see you'll find the days slipping past before you go anywhere else. Visit the lovely Minster with its dazzling stained glass windows and walk the City Walls and the Shambles to get a feel of the old city and its medieval timber-framed houses.

Then call at the Jorvik Viking Centre (it gets very busy at peak times) and take a time-car transporting you back to the city's distant past – sights, sounds and smells! And if you have any budding archaeologists in the family, visit the Archaeological Resource Centre in St Saviour's Church, where you can handle real 'finds' and pottery remains.

For train enthusiasts of all ages, don't miss the National Railway Museum, home to over 300 years of history.

Mail and messages

Please vacate your pitch by 11.15am on the day of departure. This departure time is necessary to reduce traffic congestion on very narrow local roads so that new visitors arrive after those leaving have gone. If this is difficult, please discuss with duty warden.

Safety on site

Flooding

The site can flood if the River Ouse bursts its banks, necessitating evacuation of all or part of the site. Please establish the situation with the wardens and follow their advice.

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. There is no dog walk on site but dogs can be walked off-site along the riverbank. There are heavy penalties levied by York Council for dogs that are not cleaned up after.

Fire point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at all service points. The fire assembly point is outside Reception

Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times. and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any oneway system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Security barrier

There is a security barrier on site, operated by a fob given to new arrivals.

Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at reception. Visitors will need to use the local car parks as parking on site is limited.
