Get to know your site

On the edge of the Wareham Forest, this pleasant site provides an excellent base for exploring Dorset. Wareham is the nearest town 3 miles away with a good selection of shops and places to eat. Some of the most attractive parts of Dorset are owned by the National Trust including substantial stretches of coastline.

It is rich in combes, cliffs, bays and islands and particularly rewarding for the visitor interested in birdlife and walking. Golden Cap where the Trust owns 2,000 acres of hill farmland, cliff and beach has the highest cliff in England, brilliant with yellow gorse.

This is Hardy country and you can recognise many scenes he describes in his novels. Casterbridge is Dorchester (18 miles). His birthplace, a charming thatched cottage with a garden ablaze with colour, is at Higher Bockhampton and can be visited by appointment with the National Trust. Lawrence of Arabia's house at Cloud's Hill (10 miles) is also open to visitors.

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board at the office.

Site shop

Some mobile phones do not work in the area. Public telephones – there is a public telephone located next to the lower toilet block. Please note that this phone does not accept incoming calls.

Pitches

Pitch care

Please lift awning ground sheets daily.

Motorhomes

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motorhome sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure please ask at Reception.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

TV reception

Television reception is poor, best with aerial horizontal. Digital only. The EHU bollards have a TV socket. Digital service is available by cable from the bollard.

Wi-Fi

Wi-fi internet access is available on this site. Please ask the warden for more information.

Electric hook-up

The costs of electricity are included in your pitch fee but please help us minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. Any saving could help to reduce pitch fees or help towards investment in new sites or redevelopments.

Site facilities

Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning at the following times:

Top block: 10.15am to 11.30am. (May vary in winter).

Lower block: 11.30am to 12.30pm. (May vary in winter).

The disabled toilet and shower facilities are located in the top toilet block.

Baby & toddler washrooms at lower and top blocks.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are: Washing machine £4.00, tumble drier £1.00, rinse & spin £1.00 per 15min cycle. Washing sinks are also available.

Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

Recycling facilities

On site for glass and paper, plastic and cans.

Safety on site

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site and clean up after them. Dogs can be walked off-site on the Wareham Forest 'Sika Trail'. There is a large dog walk on site.

Fire point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at the toilet blocks and water points. The fire assembly point is in car park.

Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any oneway system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception.

Electricity cables

Due to overhead power cables, it is not safe to fly kites on the site.
