Get to know Bunree

On this Caravan Club Golden Jubilee Site, your caravan can be parked almost at the water's edge of Loch Linnhe with its beauty and the splendour of the mountains across the water. This award-winning site must be one of The Club's loveliest in scenic terms: it is, quite literally, breathtaking.

You'll spend a day or two acclimatising to all this natural beauty before you even want to explore further afield. Visit Glencoe - you'll find it eerie and exciting and everyone should know the story behind the Massacre, still legendary after three centuries. On another day take a cable car to the upper terminal (2,300ft) of the Aonach Mor Mountain, for fabulous views of the mountains, the Great Glen and the islands of Skye and Rhum. If you wish to try to climb Ben Nevis (4,406ft) please allow approximately 7 hours to reach the summit and descend.

For a really scenic drive, visit Ardnamurchan and Moidart and carry on to the White Sands of Morar near Mallaig.

- **Cycling**

Good road/off road mountain bike routes within 15 miles of the site. The Sustrans National Cycle Route 78 runs from Oban to Fort William.

- **Walking**

Good walking routes near the site are the Inchree Forest Walks. There are other good walking routes within 10 miles of the site.

RECEPTION SERVICES

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board at Reception.

Site Shop

Open at the same times as Reception, 9.00am - 5.30pm. The shop sells Gas, Gaz, toilet chemicals, awning tie down kits, ice cream, milk, rolls, cold drinks, sweets, eggs and midge repellent.

Information Room

Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

Mobile & public telephones

All networks can be used on this site. Public telephone - there is a public telephone located next to Reception. Please note that this phone does not accept incoming calls.

Wi-Fi

Wi-fi internet access is available on this site. Please ask the Warden for details.

PITCHES

Pitch care

Steel awning pegs are required on this site. No awnings/canvas permitted on Loch side pitches.

Motor caravans

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motor caravan sign on display and unplug your electricity supply.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, it is normally not a problem unless the site is fully booked. Please check at the site office.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

Television

Television reception is variable, best with aerial vertical. Only digital reception is available. The EHU bollards do not have a TV socket. Satellite reception poor.

Electric Hook-up

The cost of electricity is included in your pitch fee, but please help us to minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. In 2009 The Club's expenditure on electricity was £4 million and any saving can help to reduce pitch fees or invest in new sites or redevelopments.

Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning at the following times: Gents: 11.00am to 11.45am. Ladies: 11.45am to 12.30pm. There is a baby and toddler bathroom for children under 4 years old. Keys are available from Reception. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times. The disabled toilet and shower facilities are located on the right hand side of the toilet block.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are: Washing machine £3.00, Tumble drier 70p/cycle, Spin drier 20p/cycle. Washing sinks and ironing board are also available. There is a drying room. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

SAFETY ON SITE

Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety. Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are



not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not.

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. There is a small dog walk on the north east side of the site - dogs may only be walked in this area.

Fire Point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at the service points. The fire assembly point is in the car park in front of the office.

Security barrier

There is a security barrier operated by a remote control for entry to the site.

Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception.

The closest is the Co-op in Ballachulish, about 6 miles from the site. There are Morrisons, Lidl and Tesco Metro in Fort William.
