# Get to know Godrevy Park

This spacious site is divided into areas by banking and hedgerows. A rear gate gives access to gorse-covered sand dunes, through which a ten-minute walk leads to a cliff path down to the beach facing St Ives Bay. For the less mobile, a beach-side car park is only a one mile drive away.

The area is peppered with typical little Cornish fishing villages such as Coverack, Cadgwith, Mullion, Porthleven and Mousehole.

This area enjoys the best of both worlds: it is delightfully attractive and recommended for quiet exploration, whilst there are plenty of attractions for family days out. During the school summer break, the Site hums with exuberant children.

Members are warned that bathing off the coast can be dangerous; particular note should be taken of any local warning notices.

# RECEPTION SERVICES

#### Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board at the office.

#### Site Shop

Open at the same times as Reception (closed 10.30am to 12.30pm). The shop sells Calor Gas, milk, sweets, Aqua Kem, Aqua Rinse, awning straps etc.

# **Information Room**

The Information Room is next to the office and is open at any time. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

# Mobile & public telephones

Some mobile phones do not work in the area. Public telephone - there is a public telephone by Reception. This phone does not accept incoming calls.

# **PITCHES**

#### Pitch care

Please only use breathable ground sheets and lift daily to conserve your pitch for other members.

#### **Motor caravans**

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motor caravan sign on display.

### **Vacating your pitch**

Between June and September departures must be by 12 noon. Outside of these months, if you wish to stay after 12 noon it is normally not a problem unless the site is fully booked.

#### **Barbecues**

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass. Protective slabs are available from Reception.

# TV reception

As part of the Digital Switchover, this region has now had its analogue television signal switched off. In order to watch television on site you will need an Integrated Digital TV (IDTV) or a digital receiver, and you may also need an aerial or satellite dish. # Electric Hook-up

The cost of electricity is included in your pitch fee, but please help us to minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. In 2009 The Club's expenditure on electricity was £4 million and any saving can help to reduce pitch fees or invest in new sites or redevelopments.

## **Toilets and showers**

The toilet blocks including the laundry and dishwashing are closed in sections for cleaning between the following times: 10.30am to 12.30pm. There is a baby and toddler bathroom for children under 4 years old. Keys are available from Reception. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times. The disabled toilet and shower facilities which can be accessed with a RADAR key are located in the block adjacent to the baby and toddler room. There is a special wet suit shower outside the toilet block.

#### Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are: Washing machine £3.00, Tumble drier 70p/cycle, Spin drier 60p/cycle. Washing sinks and ironing board are available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees.

#### **Ball Games**

Ball games are allowed only in the play area.

#### Recycling

Please use the recycling bins provided.

# **SAFETY ON SITE**

#### Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times within the site, and clean up after them. Dogs can be walked off-site on the sand dunes across the road and on some beaches all year (please ask for a list).



#### **Fire Point**

Located at each service point to activate alarm and warning. **Vehicles and cycles** 

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not. **Site Gates** 

The main gate is closed but not locked overnight, please always close it behind you. The back gate to the footpath to the beach is kept locked and a key is required, available for a £1 returnable deposit from Reception during office hours.

#### **Visitors**

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception. Visitors cars must be parked in the car park.

Kite flying is not allowed on site.

## One-way system

For safety, cyclists and drivers must keep to the one-way system.

# **OUT AND ABOUT**

#### **Supermarkets**

The closest are Lidl about 1.5 miles away and the Co-op in Hayle, about 2 miles from the site. There is a new retail park within 1.5 miles with M&S, Boots and Next.
