This is a long, meadow site screened with well-kept shrubs and trees, with the sea only three quarters of a mile away. It's ideal for an open-air holiday.

You're close to the bird sanctuary at Slapton Ley and if you sail, you can moor at East Portlemouth and explore the marvellous harbours and creeks of this lovely coast. The sea fishing is excellent from the beach too, so you need your tackle. Kingsbridge is an interesting old town renowned for its excellent food, with attractive buildings and an old-worlde charm.

Bathing off the coast can be dangerous and particular note must be taken of any local notices.

Mail and messages

PITCHES

Site Terrain

Gently Sloping.

Pitch care

Levelling blocks are required on some parts of the site. Awning ground sheets must be lifted daily.

Motor caravans

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motorcaravan sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, it is normally not a problem unless the site is fully booked. Please see the notice at the site office or check with the warden.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

TV reception

As part of the Digital Switchover, this region has now had its analogue television signal switched off. In order to watch television on site you will need an Integrated Digital TV(IDTV) or a digital receiver, and you may also need an aerial or satellite dish. Electric Hook-up

The cost of electricity is included in your pitch fee, but please help us to minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. In 2009 The Club's expenditure on electricity was $\pounds 4$ million and any saving can help to reduce pitch fees or invest in new sites or redevelopments.

SITE FACILITIES

Please see the Site map for locations of amenity blocks. Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning from 10.30am to 11.30am. The disabled toilet and shower facilities are located at the left side of the toilet block. There is also a baby and toddler bathroom for children under 4 years old. Please ensure that children are supervised by an adult at all times.

Laundry

Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are:

Washing machine £3.00, Spin rinse 60p/cycle, Tumble drier 70p/cycle. Washing sinks and ironing boards are also available. Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences.

SAFETY ON SITE

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on site and cleanup after them. Dogs can be walked on the top east corner of the site. Please do not let your dog into the fields behind the site as there are cattle grazing. **Fire Point**

(to activate alarm/warning) Located at each service point. The fire assembly point is by the service point at the exit from the site.



Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety.

Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not. **Visitors**

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception.

Power cables

Kites and Frisbees must not be used on site, due to overhead cables.
