Get to know White House Beach

There's a pitch to suit all tastes here, with one part of the site adjacent to the beach and the other enclosed by willow and shrubs. In early summer the foreshore is a riot of colour with wild flowers, including the rare Yellow Poppy. Although Kessingland beach is shingle, nearby Lowestoft has a sandy beach with the Blue Flag and lifeguards.

Africa Alive is a short distance from the site. Lowestoft Airshow takes place each summer. Charming Southwold is a few miles away (where the filming of Iris took place). For thrills take the children to Pleasure Wood Hills Theme Park, take a day boat on The Broads, go sea or river fishing and bird watching at Minismere or watch power boat racing on Oulton Broad. This site has something for everyone.

Good walking routes near the site are the Suffolk Coastal Path, the Nature reserve and the beach to Lowestoft and Southwold.

RECEPTION SERVICES

Mail and messages

Mail and messages are put on the board outside Reception. Site Shop

Open at the same times as Reception. The shop sells Gas, toilet chemicals, milk, eggs, ice cream, TV booster cables and EHU cables.

Information Room

Open at all times. Leaflets are available about the many attractions and places of interest that you can visit during your stay.

Mobile & public telephones

All networks can be used on this site. There is no public telephone. Wi-Fi

PITCHES

Pitch care

Awning ground sheets must be lifted daily. No awnings, canopies or windbreaks are allowed on pitches 6-18 inclusive.

Motor caravans

If your pitch is left unoccupied, please leave your motor caravan sign on display.

Vacating your pitch

If you wish to stay after 12 noon on your day of departure, please speak to the warden.

Barbecues

These are allowed on site but open fires are not. Please keep barbecues off the grass.

TV reception

The EHU bollards have a TV socket and a booster cable is required. Radio frequencies

Electric Hook-up

The cost of electricity is included in your pitch fee, but please help us to minimise our effect on the environment by considering your electricity use while on site. In 2009 The Club's expenditure on electricity was $\pounds 4$ million and any saving can help to reduce pitch fees or invest in new sites or redevelopments.

Toilets and showers

The toilet blocks are closed for cleaning at the following times: Main block: 10.30am to 12 noon Small block: 11.45am to 12 noon Beach block: 12 noon to 12.45pm

The baby and toddler room and the disabled toilet and shower facilities are located in the Main toilet block.

Laundry

Laundry is located in the main toilet block. Prices for the use of the laundry facilities are: Washing machine £3.00, Tumble drier 70p/cycle. Washing sinks and ironing boards are also available.

Please do not hang washing lines between trees or on the fences. Ball games and kites

Ball games and kite flying are not allowed on site, please use the beach area.

SAFETY ON SITE

Pets

Please keep your dog on a lead at all times on the pitching areas and roads within the site, and clean up after them. Dogs can be walked offsite on a large section of the beach reached through a hand gate directly from the site.

Fire Point

(to activate alarm/warning) Located on the Main site outside the office and all Service Points and on the Beach site near the toilet block.



Vehicles and cycles

Parents are reminded that children remain their responsibility and therefore they should be supervised at all times, and to ensure that all members of their party follow the principles of road safety. Motor vehicles and bicycles on site should, at all times, be used with due regard to the safety and convenience of others and their speed should not exceed walking pace (5mph). No cycling is permitted on site between the hours of dusk and dawn, as determined by the Wardens. Any one-way system signs should be observed by all vehicles and cycles. Foot pedalled cycles, scooters and skateboards can be used, but are not allowed on the paved area around toilet blocks and communal areas and must not be ridden on footpaths. Please note that motorised mobility scooters are allowed on site, but children's motorised scooters or skateboards are not. Security Barrier

There are security barriers on site. These are operated by a card given to new arrivals.

Visitors

Please ask your visitors to make themselves known at Reception when arriving at the site. If you are expecting visitors after hours, please meet them at Reception.
